Luke 15:1-2

Chapter fifteen of The Gospel of Luke begins this way. Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them" (Lk. 15:1, 2) Isn't it interesting that a statement that was intended to be an

insult is really one of the greatest compliments that could ever be given? Wouldn't Thought you like to be known as one who "receives sinners and eats with them?" The Pharisees and scribes saw the sinner as an enemy rather than a victim. How do we view the lost? Our perception of sinners will

directly affect our evangelistic efforts. May I remind you that someone saw you as worth saving. We need to see others in the same light. My friends. there are too many souls going off the cliff. We can't just sit there and watch them. We've gotta try and save them!

Luke 15:11-32

We often read the Parable of the Prodigal Son by zeroing in on the one that left home. Our focus is on the love of the father and the reception that his sinful son receives when he returns home. There's certainly nothing wrong with emphasizing that angle of the story. However, there are two lost sons in this parable; one that left home and one that stayed home. These two sons represent the two groups of people who were hearing Jesus' words for the first time. In the audience that day were tax collectors and sinners people who would have related

to the younger brother in the parable. There were also Pharisees and scribes They represented the elder brother. The Parable of the Prodigal Son has much to say to the lost soul, but its message is really aimed at the self-righteous. We must appreciate what the Lord has done in rescuing us. We must also appreciate the lengths He was willing to go to in order to

save all mankind.

Reflect on my salvation and allow this reflection to compel me to help others have a happy ending to their story.
