What does the Bible say about:

WALKING BY FAITH AND WALKING BY SIGHT part 2

Now in stark contrast to Abraham, let's look at Lot and his decision. We read that following a great famine Abraham and his family went to Egypt. Several things happened there, which is a lesson for another time, and when leaving both Abraham and Lot had great possessions. So much that the land could not sustain both of their herds and strife between their herdsmen arose.

Let's read Abraham's plan to fix the problem in Gen 13:8 And Abram said unto Lot, Let there be no strife, I pray thee, between me and thee, and between my herdsmen and thy herdsmen; for we be brethren. Gen 13:9 Is not the whole land before thee? separate thyself, I pray thee, from me: if thou wilt take the left hand, then I will go to the right; or if thou depart to the right hand, then I will go to the left.—

At this point Lot had a choice to make. Does he pray and allow God to be involved in the decision, or does he make the decision by asking himself what is in my best interest. This next verse is the first step in walking by sight Gen 13:10 And Lot lifted up his eyes, and beheld all the plain of Jordan, that it was well watered everywhere, before the LORD destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah, even as the garden of the LORD, like the land of Egypt, as thou comest unto Zoar.—then the second step Gen 13:11 Then Lot chose him all the plain of Jordan; and Lot journeyed east: and they separated themselves the one from the other. Then step three Gen 13:12 Abram dwelled in the land of Canaan, and Lot dwelled in the cities of the plain, and pitched his tent toward Sodom. Gen 13:13 But the men of Sodom were wicked and sinners before the LORD exceedingly.

Sadly, this decision adversely affected Lot and his family. When we attempt to make decisions without praying and including God in our decisions, we not only put ourselves in danger, but also those around us.
