What are the signs of spiritual life? Faith is a sign of life. Faith is the mouth of the soul. By faith, we satisfy our hunger and thirst for righteousness. We feed on His Word, digest it, and live. Jesus said, *"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. ...*" (John 6:51)

Spiritually alive people have an appetite. Whoever heard of inviting a dead man to eat? A dead man doesn't want food. A sure sign of a spiritually dead man is that he does not "hunger and thirst for righteousness" (Matthew 5:6).

Prayer is a sign of spiritual life. Dead men cannot speak; they do not ask. Though our prayers may be pitiful and weak, they show signs of spiritual life. Let your whole life be a prayer to God. *"And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Colossians 3:17).*

Repentance is definitely a sign of spiritual life. A dead man cannot make his past mistakes right—only the living can. God's gift to the living is repentance. "...turn to God, performing deeds in keeping with their repentance" (Acts 26:20).

Are You Dead or Alive?

"Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord. 28 Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. 29 For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself. 30 That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died."

(1 Corinthians 11:27-30).

Paul has to write some strong words to the Christians in the church at Corinth. He can't praise them about their worship. Instead he has to correct them about several things. In the passage above, he was warning them about the way they were partaking of the Lord's Supper. He says that some of them were showing that they are weak and ill spiritually. Some were even dead spiritually. Could people who come to our worship assemblies today be in the same condition? Could the apostles write similar letters of concern and warning to our churches today? How do I know if I am dead or alive?

People who can't find joy in a worship service and gain something from it prove that they are spiritually dead. When a person can't gain something from the fellowship, singing, Lord's Supper, and the sermon (regardless of who is preaching), that person is spiritually dead.

When a person has to resort to note writing, whispering, inspecting, the contents of his wallet, going through her purse, playing with children, dozing off, even clipping finger nails because he is so bored with the Word of God, that person is spiritually dead.

The person who stays glued to a television for hours but can't give
