True Love

"Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." (1 Corinthians 13:4-8a)

If it is true that 70% of all lyrics of secular songs are about love, this is added proof that it is a vital force of men of all times and all cultures. But it does need to be clearly defined, as the word is used in so many different and confusing ways.

True love summarizes/condenses all the virtues of a godly person: faith-fulness, kindness, gentleness, patience, peacefulness, goodness and self -control. It is the defining evidence of maturity, which is achieving the goal for which men were created. This kind of love is the mark of excellence within the Creator's masterpiece (you).
