The Man Born Blind

The man Jesus healed in John 9, is an intriguing fellow. He knows one fact: "I was blind, and now I see." He stubbornly maintains that fact.

Some questioned whether he was ever blind. His parents assured them he was. They asked, "How does he now see?" His parents declined to answer, but he said, "Jesus put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see." They asked, "What do you say about him, since he has opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet" -- that is, He speaks for God.

Jesus did not keep their obscure Sabbath rules; so they said Jesus is a sinner. The formerly blind man said, "One thing I know, though I was blind, now I see." They asked him twice, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He said, "I have told you already. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to be His disciples?"

They angrily replied, "You are His disciple, but we are disciples of Moses. We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where He comes from." The once blind man stuck to his one fact: "Why, here is the wonder: you cannot figure out where He came from, and yet He opened my eyes!"

If you cannot answer a person's arguments, attack the person. They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out.

Jesus found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" Knowing that Jesus is a prophet, he answered, "You tell me who he is and I will believe." Jesus said, "It is He who is speaking to you." He said, "Lord I believe," and he worshiped Him.
